

VERBS OF CHANGE

adapt: to gradually change your behaviour and attitudes in order to be successful in a new situation

alter: to change, or to make someone or something change;
to make a piece of clothing longer, wider etc so that it fits

convert: to change something into a different form of thing, or to change something so that it can be used for a different purpose or in a different way

shift: to move from one place or position to another, or make something do this;
to change a situation, discussion etc by giving special attention to one idea or subject instead of to a previous one

switch: to change from doing or using one thing to doing or using another

transfer: to move from one place, school, job etc to another, or to make someone do this, especially within the same organization;
to sell a sports player to another team

transform: to completely change the appearance, form, or character of something or someone, especially in a way that improves it

vary: to change something to make it different:
